- It may just mean taking the road less travelled.

Students who wish to apply for admission to junior colleges (JC), Millennia Institute (MI), polytechnics, and the Institute of Technical Education (ITE) may do so via the Joint Admissions Exercise (JAE) using their GCE O-Level examination results.

Eligible school and private candidates will receive a digital copy of Form A1 via their registered email addresses from 3pm on Friday, 10 January 2025. All candidates eligible for JAE may also download a copy of Form A from the JAE-Internet System (JAE-IS) during the application period.



The JAE-IS will be accessible from 4pm on Friday, 10 January 2025, to 4pm on Wednesday, 15 January 2025 for applicants to submit their course choices through the JAE website at www.moe.gov.sg/jae.

Applicants are strongly encouraged to complete the JAE worksheet (www.moe.gov.sg/jaeworksheet) before submitting their online application. The JAE-IS can be accessed using **Singpass**.

Application Results

The posting results of the JAE application will be released on **Tuesday**, **4 February 2025** via:

- Short Message Service (SMS) to the Singapore mobile phone number provided by the applicant during application
- b. JAE-IS, which is accessible through the JAE website



Applicants posted to JCs and MI are to report to their posted institutions on Wednesday, 5 February 2025.

If they are unable to do so due to valid reasons, they should contact their posted school directly to confirm that they are taking up the place, and the school will reserve the place for them.

Applicants posted to ITE will receive an email with the enrolment details on Tuesday, 4 February 2025, and applicants posted to polytechnics will receive their enrolment details by end-February 2025.



Direct School Admission (DSA) – JCs

Students who had accepted offers through the 2024 Direct School Admission for Junior Colleges (DSA-JC) will be admitted to their chosen JC if they have met the JC admission criteria based on their GCE O-Level examination results. Students admitted to a JC through DSA-JC <u>will not be eligible</u> to participate in the JAE. Students who do not meet the JC admission criteria may take part in the JAE to apply for other courses which they are eligible for.



Early Admissions Exercise (EAE) – Polytechnics

For students who had earlier accepted conditional offers to a polytechnic course through the Polytechnic Early Admissions Exercise (EAE) in 2024, their offers would have been confirmed and they will not be eligible to participate in the JAE, if they meet the following criteria:

- (a) A net ELR2B2 score of 26 points or lower for the GCE O-Level examinations; and
- (b) Minimum Entry Requirements for the respective polytechnic courses.

Early Admissions Exercise (EAE) - Polytechnics

Students who do not meet the previous stated criteria may instead apply for polytechnic admission via the JAE for courses which they are eligible for.

<u>Early Admissions Exercise (EAE) – ITE</u>

For students who had earlier accepted conditional offers to an ITE course through the ITE EAE in 2024, their offers would have been confirmed based on their GCE O-Level examination results, once they meet the subject-specific Minimum Entry Requirements for the course.



Polytechnic Foundation Programme and Direct Polytechnic Programme

Secondary 4 Normal (Academic) [N(A)] students who have sat for GCE O-Level subjects in 2024 can use their GCE O-Level results to apply for a place in the Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP) and Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP).

Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP)

The PFP is an alternative to the Secondary 5 N(A) year. It is a one-year foundation programme offered at the polytechnics which provides students with a practice-oriented approach to prepare them for entry into the relevant diploma courses.



Polytechnic Foundation Programme

Students are eligible to apply for the PFP if they obtain a raw ELMAB3 aggregate of 12 points or lower and meet the subject-specific requirements for their chosen course.

PFP-eligible students will receive a **copy of Form P** from their respective secondary schools in person. Each copy of Form P contains a unique password. Interested students should use their respective passwords to submit their applications online via the PFP website at pfp.polytechnic.edu.sg/PFP/index.html.

More information on the eligibility requirements for the PFP, as well as how GCE O-Level results are considered in the computation of the ELMAB3 aggregate, can be found on the PFP website indicated above.



Polytechnic Foundation Programme

Applications for the PFP will open from 1.30pm on Friday, 10 January 2025, to 4pm on Wednesday, 15 January 2025.

The PFP posting results will be released at **1.30pm on Wednesday, 22 January 2025 through the PFP website**. Students will thereafter be required to indicate whether they wish to accept, reject, or appeal for a change of course by 4pm on Monday, 27 January 2025.



<u>Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic (DPP)</u>

Eligible Secondary 4 N(A) students may submit their DPP applications online via the DPP application portal at www.ite.edu.sg/apply-for-ite-courses

Applications for the DPP will open from 12am on Friday, 10 January 2025, to 11.59pm on Tuesday, 14 January 2025.

The DPP posting results for applications made under the final application phase will be released at **9am on Friday**, **17 January 2025 through the DPP application portal**. Students will be required to indicate whether they accept or reject the DPP offer by 11.59pm on Tuesday, 21 January 2025.



Direct Polytechnic Program

Students who have been offered a place in the DPP under the final application phase should **report to ITE on Wednesday, 22 January 2025** upon acceptance of their DPP course offer.

The last day of school for Secondary 5 students who have accepted a place in the PFP will be on Friday, 31 January 2025. Students will be informed by the respective polytechnics on the enrolment dates for the PFP.

Students who have accepted a place in the earlier application phase of the DPP in December but decide to take up a PFP offer now must withdraw from the DPP first before they are able to take up the PFP offer. DPP-enrolled students should check with their ITE class advisor for more details on the DPP withdrawal process and deadlines for withdrawal

Appeal for Review of Results

Candidates who had sat for 2024 GCE O-Level examination may apply to appeal for a review of their results. All appeals by candidates together with the payment of appeal fees must be submitted through schools by Thursday, 16 January 2025. Late applications will not be considered. Please approach the General Office for the appeals.

Please note that reasons related to Special Consideration (e.g. unwell, bereavement) cannot be considered for the appeal for review of results.



For Application to JC/ MI

School admissions are based on **merit**. In the JAE, posting decisions are based on objective and transparent measures of academic merit, i.e. L1R5 net aggregate score, therefore JC transfers after the JAE should be guided by L1R5 net aggregate scores and the receiving JC's course Cut-Off Point (COP).

Please fill up all **12 options** available to you for **JAE**.

Choose JCs/Poly courses which meet your results. Have 1 or 2 options where your results exceed course cut off point.



Appeals will only be entertained if you meet the JC's/Poly's course **cut off point**.

Print and retain a copy of the Verification Slip for your record after you have submitted your application online.
